Harvester Microform are proud to be working with the Library of Congress on the microform publication of the Archives of the F.W.P., (known as the Federal Writers' Project until mid-1939, thereafter the Federal Writers' Program).

The FWP was one of the most active programs established by the New Deal administration. It was a part of the W.P.A. (the Work Projects Administration, known as the Works Progress Administration until July 1, 1939) which was set up on May 6, 1935, with responsibility for the Government's work-relief program, and succeeded as the Federal Emergency Relief Administration (FERA) and the Civil Works Administration (CWA), both established in 1933

The FWP was part of 'Federal One', the overall title of the Arts Project established by the WPA covering Music, Theatre, Art and Writers. The WPA recognised that steelworkers, bricklayers, share croppers and factory workers were not the only sectors of the economy hit by the Depression. Academics, postgraduate students, journalists, playwrights and novelists were all out of work. In its first five years the FWP spent \$27 million putting this motley crew to work. It provided a literary training and more importantly, the opportunity for participants to observe, eat and write.

Whilst the main records of the WPA are in the National Archives (Record Group 69), the main FWP archive is in the Library of Congress. The massive size of the archive and its range reveals the wide-ranging nature of the activities of the FWP. In total, there are some 400,000 items, or 630 linear feet of archives. These occupy 1080 containers (numbered A $1\,$ - A $1080)\,$.

A 581 - A 738

Records of the Folk-lore Project, 1936-1939 The Folk-lore Survey embraced the study of all native and immigrant cultures and traditions. John A. Lomax, the first director of folk-lore for the FWP, and a renowned 'ballad hunter', pioneered fieldwork recording traditional cultural expressions. The project collected love, legend, poems and songs and made an important contribution to ethnomusicology. More than anything, though, it captured a body of information that tells us much about the development of America and its population. The files principally contain manuscript

The files principally contain manuscript and typescript essays and notes.

A 739 - A 760

Records of the Social-Ethnic Studies Survey, 1789-19411
This was a sweeping attempt to record the dispersion and impact of immigrant culture in America from 1789-1940, and offers a detailed analysis of many communities and neighbourhoods nation-wide. Again, the files principally contain manuscript and typescript essays.

A 761 - A 872

Special Studies and Projects, 1691-1942 A large, miscellaneous assembly of other FWP project reports.

A 873 - A 890

Negro Studies Project, 1722-1739
Testimonies from negroes throughout America describe their experiences and trace their origins. There are essays on particular areas and occurrences, transcripts of slave notices, oral transcripts, and more detailed data on the negro population.

A 891 - A 932

Slave Narrative Project, 1705-1938 Specifically focussed on the topic of slavery, this section includes a mass of oral transcripts, notices, and documents. The bulk of this particular class has now appeared in print and is readily available. A 933 - A 1039 Miscellaneous Files

A 1040 - A 1080 Printed Hatter, 1935-1942
This is the complete surviving FWP file set of their publications - both printed and mimeograph.

State Depositories often have further records relating to their own state FWP project. A very useful survey of these records was recently published by the American Historical Association: Ann Banks and Robert Carter, Survey of the Federal Writers' Project Manuscript Holdings in State Depositories, AHA, Washington D.C., 1985.

The intention of this microfilm project is to make the central records more widely available so that scholars in a particular area can build up a local and national picture of the activities of the FWP.

This first series concentrates on A 1040 - A 1080 and offers access to the single most comprehensive set of FWP publications that exists. The range of subjects is extremely wide. There are radio plays, sociological essays, explorations of heritage (both folk tales and history), guides to cities, states, and regions, instructional booklets, and contemporary records of art, literature, politics, and everyday life.

Part One contains the publications from Alabama-Illinois. Part Two contains the publications from Indiana-New York. Part Three contains the publications from North Carolina-Wyoming, together with 'National and Regional' Publications.

The Publications of the FWP

This unique collection of the publications of the FWP - their own file set - provides scholars with an extremely lively and detailed picture of life in America during the Great Depression. Almost every aspect of life is covered from Industry and Labor Relations, through Welfare and Government, to Sports and Hobbies.

The American State Guide series has been omitted as this is readily available in reprint and was the one series that most major libraries acquired when they were first published. Conversely, the publications in this microform project are extremely rare - but they are essential for any study of the whole range of materials produced by the FWP.

This set includes a number of important City Guides, that

should be read alongside the major State Guides. A few examples are Aberdeen: A middle border city, Cincinatti (described through3 guides produced for the sesquicentennial celebration), Louisville: A guide to the falls city, and San Diego: A California city. Similarly there are county guides for regions of Kentucky, Minnesota, Ohio, and other states, and numerous historical booklets (eg Abe Lincoln in Illinois, and Great Spanish American Liberators) reflecting the historical drive of the FWP.

There are publications that sprang out of the important social-ethnic studies carried out by the FWP. For instance, The Armenians in Massachusetts, Immigrant America, The Italians of New York, the Cavalcade of the American Negro, Immigrant settlements in Connecticut, and Survey of Negroes in Little Rock and North Little Rock.

Industrial and labor issues are addressed in publications such as Annals of labor and industry in Illinois, Flax in Oregon, The growth of RCA,Intra-Urban mobili ty~"in Omaha, A technical review of early Comstock mining methods, and the Work and Employment Readers for Adults.

Social and Community issues are covered by items including The Adult Education Outlook, Advancing Public Health 1939-1940, Guides to Cultural Organisations, Diptheriaandits prevention, Family Welfare, Mentalhygiene clinic, Models for the Blind"] and Radio in Education.

Then there are the more ephemeral or even frivolous items: Autumn hikes. Baseball in Old Chicago, Fish are Fighters in Alabama, Fleas" - their habits and control, Softball, Little animals (lithographs by Alyn), and Songs by Stephen Foster. But even these are important to the historian. They are part of the time-capsule that captures the 1930's in print. In the way that they are written or in the facts they include, they justify some of the accusation levelled against the FWP.

Original poems and plays were also published by the FWP. This programme includes The Indians' protest: A play in one act, and Poems, by Elma Scheel, Flora Rivola, Jill Spargur, and others. Radio scripts include Play Room, by Riley Hughes. And there are short stories such as Blizzard, by George W. Hall, and Des hitch-hiking besness, by Virgil Aiken.

Also reflected are the endeavours of the Folk-lore units of the FWP. Pioneering work on the American Indian was partly released in publications such as The Crow Legend of Creation, The Havasupai and the Hualapai, Santee-Sioux Indian Tegends, The Naming of the Blackfeet, The Navaho,

Seminole Indian Legends. Whilst other aspects of Folk culturearerevealedby Alabama. Facts. Events. Places. Tours, Ballads, John Brown~Pioneer Tales, and Pioneer ReligTon.

The importance of these publications for the social historian cannot be overestimated. The style of writing, the designs and typography and the written contents, all add up to a remarkable picture of this depressed and yet creative period of American history.

This Finding Aid

This finding aid provides three separate means of access to this Collection.

The Contents of Reels provides a listing of all publications organized by State, which is how the material has been filmed. It provides titles, authors (where known), date of publication (where known), extent and a note on any series that the item is a part of.

The Title Index provides the same information, but organized alphabetically by title and giving reel references.

The Author Index provides a list of works arranged alphabetically by author, where known, and gives reel references .

Further Series

Series Two includes the extensive, unpublished Surveys of American Life and Culture that were also a part of the activities of the FWP. Principally, this involves material from A 739 - A 760 The Social-Ethnic Studies Survey: A 873 - A 890 The Negro Studies Project: and A 581 - A 738 The Folk-lore Project.

For every printed pamphlet, article or book of the FWP, there were more than a dozen unpublished surveys. The richness, importance and utility of these records has been demonstrated by the previously published Slave Narrative Records.

The Social-Ethnic Studies Survey was amongst the first and mostimportant ofits kind. In a sweeping attempt to record the dispersion and impact of immigrant culture in America from 1789 to 1940, communities and neighbourhoods are recorded in detail. In Chicago, for instance, there are essays on the American, Chinese, Italian, Jewish, Laotian, Polish and other communities.

The Negro Studies Survey ranges far and wide. Testimonies from negroes throughout America describe their experiences and trace their origins. There are essays on particular areas and occurrences, transcripts of slave notices, oral transcripts, and more detailed data on the negro population. Important contributors to the project were Sterling Brown, poet and professor of English at Howard University, Jack Conroy, author of The Disinherited, who worked with the FWP in Missouri and then Illinois, and Richard Wright, whose experiences on the project contributed to many of his writings including Uncle Tom's Children, Native Son, Black Boy, and The Outsider.

The Folk-lore Survey embraced the study of all native and immigrantcultures and traditions. John A. Lomax, the first director of folk-lore for the FWP, and a renowned "ballad hunter", pioneered fieldwork recording traditional cultural expressions. The project collected lore, legend, poems and songs and made an important contribution to ethnomusicology. More than anything, though, it captured a body of information that tells us much about the development of America and its population.
