# INTRODUCTION

In view of the turbulent and controversial character of Lyndon Baines Johnson's presidency, the oral history is well-suited to capture the complex nature of Johnson's years in office. Virtually every major issue addressed by the Johnson administration—civil rights, poverty, and the Vietnam War in particular—elicited sharply disparate views from segments of the American public and from within the government itself. The flexibility of the oral history technique lends itself readily to the recording of multiple viewpoints, since the interviewee is free to backtrack and embellish previous topics whenever the flow of ideas calls associated insights to mind. Moreover, the technique encourages the interviewee to be an active participant in the reconstruction of past events, so that he or she can suggest a fertile line of inquiry that even a well-prepared interviewer might have failed to anticipate.

Finally, the oral history is a natural vehicle for the candid exposition of personal perspectives, and candor on the part of those who knew and served under Lyndon Johnson is indispensable to a thorough comprehension of a presidency that was rife with paradox.

The firsthand recollections that are reproduced in this microform publication reveal, in a readily accessible form, fresh perspectives on Lyndon Johnson the man, on Lyndon Johnson the president, and on the speakers themselves. Most importantly, these oral histories recapture the experiences and impressions of those who served during the eventful Johnson presidency—many in key policy-making positions, all of them "insiders" to some degree. For nearly every key event in this period, the oral histories contain candid recollections, many of which did not appear in contemporaneous documents. Within the two installments of *Oral Histories of the Johnson Administration*, published by University Publications of America, the researcher will find commentary on the major issues of the 1960s: the Vietnam War, the civil rights movement, and the War on Poverty. Oral histories such as these, whether consulted alone or in conjunction with the official documentation of the era, provide scholars with information available from no other source.

# **EDITORIAL NOTE**

The Lyndon Baines Johnson Library in Austin, Texas, contains millions of pages of documentation about Lyndon Johnson and his times, including the largest collection of oral histories concerning Johnson's political career and presidency. Interviews, sometimes more than one, with more than one thousand people interviewed, are reflected in more than 1,500 transcripts. Due to privacy restrictions, however, not all of these transcripts are available for this publication.

Because of the number and variety of persons interviewed, University Publications of America (UPA) has grouped the interviews included in its micropublications according to the nature of their sources and published them in two installments of the series, *Oral Histories of the Johnson Administration*. The first installment, entitled *Part I: The White House and Executive Departments,* contains more than three hundred interviews with key officials and aides from almost every sector of the executive branch under Johnson. UPA has published in their entirety all of the "open" or nonrestricted oral history transcripts, as well as some that were formerly "closed" or restricted by the interviewee. Such a restriction is noted at the end of the descriptive material in the Fiche Index that follows.

Part II: The Congress, the Judiciary, Public Figures, and Private Individuals includes over four hundred oral histories of Johnson's colleagues in the House of Representatives and the Senate; Supreme Court justices and members of the federal and state judiciary; labor, religious, business, and civil rights leaders; members of the legal community and the media; and many others, including longtime personal friends. (Six oral histories intended to be microfilmed in *Part II* are found in *Part I* and are so designated with an asterisk.)

Many transcripts contain their own table of contents. A combined alphabetical list of the interviewees in *Part I and Part II* is included at the end of the guide, directing the user to the page number where the entry describing the location on the microfiche or microfilm where an individual's interview(s) can be found.

# SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The transcripts of the oral histories found in this micropublication are the products of projects conducted by the University of Texas at Austin and the Lyndon Baines Johnson Library, also in Austin, Texas. Together, these interviews provide an inside perspective on the Johnson administration and the major issues of the 1960s.

Within Part I of Oral Histories of the Johnson Administration, the researcher interested in interviewees intimate with the Vietnam War will find oral histories from, among others, William Bundy, assistant secretary of state for Pacific and East Asian Affairs; Chester L. Cooper, assistant, National Security Council, and assistant to Averell Harriman on Vietnam; William Colby, chief of the Far East Division of the CIA; Averell Harriman, ambassador at large and chief negotiator for the United States at the Paris peace talks; General Maxwell Taylor, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and U.S. ambassador to Vietnam; and General William Westmoreland, commanding general of the U.S. Army in Vietnam.

Also found in *Part I* are interviews with major political figures, such as Vice-President Hubert Humphrey; consumer advisers Betty Furness Midgley and Ester Peterson; CIA director Richard Helms; and Secretary of the Interior Stewart L. Udall. Data and insights on Johnson's War on Poverty can be gleaned from the interviews of Frank Mankiewicz, Stephen Pollack, Adam Yarmolinsky, Jule Sugerman, Robert A. Levine, and Otis Singletary.

The interviews with national leaders alone do not, however, provide the researcher with a comprehensive view of the Johnson era. Realizing this, the interviewers also obtained oral histories from many government and public personalities who, although not household names, still played key roles or participated in important occasions within the Johnson era. Interviews with people such as Juanita Roberts, Johnson's personal secretary, and Clarence M. Mitchell, Jr., a member of the President's Commission to Employ the Physically Handicapped, provide a more comprehensive view of the Johnson era.

Part II of the series contains interviews with such diverse personalities as evangelist Billy Graham, CBS news correspondent Dan Rather, Senator John Tower of Texas, and Thurgood Marshall, associate justice of the U.S. Supreme Court. Researchers will also acquire well-rounded insight through the recollections of Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis, Dr. Benjamin Spock, Thomas "Tip" O'Neill, and Lester Maddox. Senators Strom Thurmond (South Carolina), Stuart Symington (Missouri), Daniel Inouye (Hawaii), Everett Dirksen (Illinois), and Henry Jackson (Washington) are all represented, as well as hundreds of others whose perspectives of the times reveal a rich and varied source for the researcher interested in the oral histories of the Johnson administration.

# **FICHE/REEL INDEX**

The following index is a guide to both the microfiche and microfilm editions of *Part I* and *Part II* of *Oral Histories of the Johnson Administration, 1963–1969.* This index is arranged alphabetically by the last name of the interviewee. The numbers appearing in parentheses to the right of an interviewee's name identify the location, within the collection, of an oral history for that person. The first set of numbers indicates the oral history's location in the *microfiche* edition. Numbers to the right of the slash indicate the oral history's location in the *microfilm* edition. First is the reel number, followed by a colon and the four-digit frame number at which the oral history begins.

Next the researcher will find the position(s) held by the interviewee during his/her association with Lyndon Johnson, followed by the years the interviewee held the position(s). In cases where years are not identified, the notation "n.d." appears (some years overlap into other administrations or cover previous administrations). The next block of information informs the researcher of the number of interviews given and their accession (AC) number at the Lyndon B. Johnson Library. In cases where the Lyndon B. Johnson Library has assigned two accession numbers to one interview, the second number appears in brackets in the guide. If more than one interview is included, the interviews are numbered. The name of the interviewer and the project with which he/ she is associated are found next, followed by the date(s) of the interview (s). Missing pages or portions of interviews that are not available are noted in brackets that represents the date the interview was released for publication. "No date" indicates that a release date was unavailable. Page counts may differ in fiche and film. If so, the fiche page count will be indicated in brackets. If there are any copyright or restrictive covenants on the tape(s) or transcript(s) of the interview, these are noted after the interviewer information.

Material such as correspondence is included with some oral histories and is noted on the line following the page count.
