SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Richard M. Nixon National Security Files, 1969–1974, Western Europe, consists of the working files of President Nixon's special assistant for national security affairs, Henry A. Kissinger. The collection includes letters, treaty drafts, reports, and memos from the State Department, Defense Department, FBI, CIA, U.S. Information Agency, and various U.S. embassies. Countries covered are Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Finland, France, Federal Republic of Germany, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, United Kingdom, and the Vatican.

This collection focuses primarily on European involvement in Middle Eastern conflicts, the Vietnam War, and the People's Republic of China. After the Suez Canal crisis and the Six-Day War in 1967, the Middle East region had an explosive and often violent atmosphere. The United States, along with the Soviet Union and most of Western Europe, tried to broker peaceful, or at least civil, relations between the Arab states and the state of Israel. Every reel in this collection contains evidence of the voluminous correspondence and reports that resulted from European-U.S. Middle East peace negotiations. The U.S. Middle East initiative and the subsequent foreign reactions can be found on Reel 7, Frame 0658.

The Soviet Union, Italy, and France proposed their own policies for peace. The Soviet Union strongly supported the United Arab Republic, a union between Egypt and Syria, despite its violations of cease-fire agreements. The United States sided with Israel by sending aid and arms. Western European nations occupied a strange middle ground where the U.S.-USSR relationship influenced their Middle East policies as much as the actual actions of Middle Eastern countries. Far enough removed from World War II, many European countries feared that the U.S. government would implement a junior-senior relationship if they did not begin to assert larger roles in foreign affairs (Reel 11).

Under Charles de Gaulle, France especially worried that the United States and the Soviet Union would carve the world into two realms (Reel 8). France sought to distance itself from the United Kingdom, and their frosty relationship created difficulties in the still-evolving European Community (EC; the European Union's predecessor). To further complicate matters, the EC, the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, and the United Nations were in the process of establishing their identities and roles in foreign affairs. Many documents in this collection cover the establishment of U.S.-EC relations as well as internal diplomatic and economic relations.

Civil aviation rights and cooperation was a prominent issue between the United States and Belgium, France, Ireland, the Netherlands, and Switzerland. Negotiations regarding landing rights of the Belgian Sabena Airlines and the Dutch KLM Airlines in the United States were inevitably tied to U.S. landing rights and airline safety in Europe. Middle East tensions ensured that hijacking and terrorism were also factors in military and civil aviation negotiations, with Arab terrorist organizations claiming responsibility for both a Swissair crash and the TWA hijacking in 1969. Cuba signed antihijacking agreements with both Canada and the United States and, during U.S. base negotiations, Spain and

Portugal often expressed a fear of Arab retaliation (Reels 23 and 20). Arab states often perceived aid from and cooperation with the United States as the equivalent of supporting Israel. Keeping the European oil supply flowing depended on maintaining positive relations with countries such as Saudi Arabia, which had already boycotted the Netherlands (Reel 19).

On the other side of the world, the Vietnam War became a major issue in European-U.S. relations. "As a result of the tragic involvement in Vietnam, the United States [was] still undergoing a reassessment of her global role," according to Sir John Rodgers, and every European country had its own view on the conflict (Reel 9, Frame 0493).

Switzerland and the Vatican invested many diplomatic hours in negotiating the release of American POWs from the Democratic Republic of Vietnam. France offered opinions and advice on the U.S. bombings in Cambodia and Laos. Countries such as Canada and Norway kept an eye on U.S. sensitivities while also seeking to recognize the government of North Vietnam.

Another issue of U.S. sensitivity was the People's Republic of China (PRC) and the recognition of its government by European countries. Many countries wanted the PRC to join the United Nations, even though the PRC had not requested membership. The U.S. government tracked which countries were considering PRC recognition or breaking relations with Taiwan. Not surprisingly, President Richard M. Nixon's trips to mainland China and Moscow were of extreme interest to European leaders and receive much coverage in this collection.

To a lesser extent, the collection also focuses on Ostpolitik, the relations between the Federal Republic of Germany (FRG) and the German Democratic Republic (GDR). U.S.-FRG offset negotiations (on the types and amounts of monetary and military aid to be exchanged) dominate the papers in the Germany folders, as does the FRG-GDR traffic treaty. Negotiations continued on Mutual and Balance Force Reductions in Europe, as well as the U.S. military relocation costs from France (Reel 9).

Throughout the collection, the United States and Western European countries seem to be trying to redefine their roles in the world. Two decades removed from the immediate aftermath of World War II, Western European countries were generally stabilized and needed less U.S. aid. The undeniable U.S.-European interdependence, however, created the need for international monetary reform and increased scientific cooperation. At the same time, European African and South American territories received or pushed for independence. The resulting independence and the creation of new countries sparked fresh tensions that spanned the globe, ranging from the Middle East crises to the secession attempt by Biafra from Nigeria (1967–1970). Adding to the continued tension between the United States and the Soviet Union, the world revealed by the Nixon National Security Files proves to be complex, fragile, and incredibly interesting.

Other topics covered include visits to the United States by foreign leaders, Henry A. Kissinger's conversations with those leaders, European governments, narcotics control, nuclear development, and international law. The documents in the United Kingdom folders have, unfortunately, been removed by the archivists. LexisNexis has published other collections on Western Europe, a short list of which can be found on the back cover.

The documents reproduced in this microfilm publication are historical materials from the Richard M. Nixon Presidential Materials, National Security Council Files, Country Files—Europe, in the custody of the National Archives in College Park, Maryland.
