# SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

LexisNexis filmed *The Papers of Eleanor Roosevelt, 1945–1952, Part 2: General Correspondence, 1948–1949*, from holdings at the Franklin D. Roosevelt Library in Hyde Park, New York. In addition to correspondence, the collection includes reports, newspaper and periodical clippings, poetry, musical scores, and short stories. The documents are organized by year, and folders within each year are broken into brief alphabetical ranges, resulting in over three thousand folders on thirty-three reels of film. Reels one through eight and part of nine contain correspondence from 1948, and reels nine through thirty-three contain the bulk of the correspondence from 1949. Correspondents include members of the Harry S. Truman administration and other government officials, especially from the Department of State, Charl Ormond Williams, Walter White, Helen Gahagan Douglas, Trygve Lie, Madam Chiang Kai-shek, Henry Morgenthau Jr., and members of the Roosevelt family. Most correspondents, however, were ordinary men and women simply seeking an audience with one of the most influential women of their time.

Eleanor Roosevelt's work as a U.S. delegate to the United Nations (UN) constitutes one of the major topics in this collection. Eleanor Roosevelt (ER) was not only a delegate to the UN, but she also served on the UN Human Rights Commission (UNHR), which had the task of drafting a Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Due to ER's UN work, she received many letters related to the UN and world government. Many individuals expressed gratitude and admiration to ER for undertaking this task on behalf of the United States and the world. Not all of the correspondence, however, was favorable. ER often received letters critical of her work, the UNHR, and the declaration on which they worked. The following ER response to one critic of her UN work is typical: "It seems to me more practical to try to make the UN work as well as possible, learning constantly by association more about each other. In the long run your ideal [of world federalism] may be possible of attainment" (Reel 17, Frame 0622). The subjects of world government and world peace occupied the thoughts of many ER correspondents. Many sent her ideas for attaining both, while other correspondents criticized her for her personal associations, such as with the Americans for Democratic Action (ADA) and her stance on issues relating to the Soviet Union and Spain, which they felt would lead to war and not peace.

Roosevelt's UN work made her a very public figure worldwide and thus a recipient of letters not only from men and women in the United States but from abroad as well. Most of the foreign correspondence relates to refugees, immigration, and obtaining passports and visas. Correspondents believed that ER's work on the UNHR gave her a special position in which to broker a passport for their immigration or give them a voice for human rights abuses. Since the time period in this collection falls not long after the end of World War II, the subject of immigration and refugees is quite extensive.

Again because of the close proximity to World War II, ER also received documents from the International Refugee Organization (IRO) detailing their work in postwar Europe. The last few hundred frames on Reel 19, for example, contain quarterly and yearly reports from the Child Search Branch of the International Tracing Service of the IRO. The reports contain information on attempts to register unaccompanied children in Allied occupied zones in Germany and reunite them with their families and relatives, if possible. The report chronicles the process of registering children, compiling as much information on them as possible, and locating relatives in the countries of Europe. A fair

number of documents are in German, French, Polish, and other European languages. The last folder on Reel 19 also contains a report on the Lebensborn program of Nazi leader Heinrich Himmler. The report details the program's origins, organizational structure, and activities such as "Germanizing" children and kidnapping "racially pure" children from alien nations. The folder further contains copies and translations of original Nazi documents detailing policies on children, orphaned or otherwise, from places such as Poland, specifically Lidice, and how they will be placed with German families and re-educated. The documents discuss the fact that children were first examined to determine if they were "racially desirable" and then were placed in homes or camps depending on the outcome of that determination.

Letters from U.S. men and women deal mostly with domestic issues such as U.S.-Soviet relations, ER's charity and philanthropic work, poems and tributes written about Franklin D. Roosevelt, civil rights and race relations, and requests for obtaining employment, both governmental and private. Dovetailing with the issue of employment is that of financial assistance and personal income. Correspondents often asked ER for monetary donations due to financial hardships. ER donated time and money to numerous charitable organizations, such as the Wiltwyck School for Boys, an interracial school for troubled youth in New York; but she still occasionally sent personal donations to individuals or more often attempted to direct them to other resources.

The church and state debate is one domestic issue that takes center stage in this collection. The Catholic Church, and Francis Cardinal Spellman in particular, called for federal aid to parochial schools and the use of school buses for children attending those schools. ER opposed this idea and was a strong supporter of separation of church and state. Spellman harshly criticized her as being anti-Catholic. Many documents in this collection deal with the overall debate, Spellman's response to ER, and ER's personal stance. She received nearly universal support, even from Catholics, with only slight criticism of her stance. The folders containing correspondence from Charl Ormond Williams hold a great deal of material on this topic (see Reel 9, Frame 0001 and Reel 33, Frames 0013 and 0202).

ER's personal life was just as full as her public life. Her time away from the UN was often spent traveling around the United States and abroad in order to participate in speaking engagements. Large portions of this collection deal with attempts to have ER appear for certain groups, and many of these appeals include lengthy documents explaining the nature of the engagement. ER also had a radio program with her daughter Anna Roosevelt Boettiger and completed her book *This I Remember* during 1948 and 1949. Due to ER's frequent speaking and radio appearances, she received many letters asking her to participate in contests or to serve as an honorary member of organizational boards. One correspondent, for example, sent ER information on the Voice of Democracy radio contest for junior and senior high school students in North Carolina hoping that ER would consent to being a judge for the contest. The documents highlight previous winners of the contest, including a picture and short biography of a 14-year-old Charles Kurault (Reel 32, Frame 0081). When not traveling or working for the UN, ER sought refuge in her Hyde Park, New York, home. But this solitude was often interrupted by visitors, both invited and not, as well as personal work that she was asked to do. Publishing companies, for example, often sent her unpublished manuscripts for review. Harper & Brothers sent her the galleys for Irwin Ross's *Strategy for Liberals*, which can be found on Reel 28. Harper & Brothers hoped to use ER's comments on the book's dust jacket.

As can be seen, Eleanor Roosevelt had many public and private associations. She was constantly called on to give her opinion on domestic and foreign situations, which she always did in a caring but firm manner. The following is one example of her response to a correspondent: "We are extremely fortunate to be living in America and

our good fortune gives us a responsibility as citizens in the leading Democracy of the world. The eyes of the world are on us and as we make our democracy work, we will encourage those who long for freedom. We must fight discrimination and intolerance and learn to look upon people as individuals and not as belonging to any race, nationality or religion. We, in the United States, have much to be proud of, some things to be ashamed of and every opportunity to improve and progress" (Reel 21, Frames 0572–0573).

# EDITORIAL NOTE

This microform collection consists of a wide variety of correspondence received by Eleanor Roosevelt during the post–White House years. The General Correspondence File consists primarily of incoming correspondence except for a small quantity of carbon copies of outgoing correspondence. In general, carbon copies were not kept for every typed outgoing letter nor were copies made of outgoing handwritten material. The General Correspondence File is subdivided into three chronological series: 1945–1952, 1953–1956, and 1957–1962. The file folders of correspondence in each series are arranged in alphabetical order, with the individual documents in chronological order within each folder.

LexisNexis has microfilmed all of the documents dated 1948 through 1949 within each alphabetically arranged folder in the 1945–1952 series as *The Eleanor Roosevelt Papers from the FDR Library, General Correspondence, Part 2: 1948–1949*. A small number of documents outside the 1948–1949 time frame have been microfilmed. These are primarily responses or follow-up letters to earlier correspondence and have been included in an effort to provide the researcher with a complete record on a specific topic or action.

**E**leanor Roosevelt's work as a U.S. delegate to the United Nations constitutes one of the major topics in this collection. Eleanor Roosevelt was not only a delegate to the United Nations, but she also served on the UN Human Rights Commission (UNHR), which had the task of drafting a Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

Roosevelt's UN work made her a very public figure worldwide and thus a recipient of letters not only from men and women in the United States but from abroad as well. Most of the foreign correspondence relates to refugees, immigration, and obtaining passports and visas. Correspondents believed that Eleanor Roosevelt's work on the UNHR gave her a special position in which to broker a passport for their immigration or to give them a voice for human rights abuses.

Again because of the close proximity to World War II, Eleanor Roosevelt also received documents from the International Refugee Organization (IRO) detailing their work in postwar Europe. One folder in this collection contains a report on the Lebensborn program of Nazi leader Heinrich Himmler. The report details the program's origins, organizational structure, and activities such as "Germanizing" children and kidnapping "racially pure" children from alien nations.

Letters from U.S. men and women deal mostly with domestic issues such as U.S.-Soviet relations, Eleanor Roosevelt's charity and philanthropic work, poems and tributes written about Franklin D. Roosevelt, civil rights and race relations, and requests for obtaining employment, both governmental and private. Dovetailing with the issue of employment is that of financial assistance and personal income. Correspondents often asked Eleanor Roosevelt for monetary donations due to financial hardships. Indeed, she donated time and money to numerous charitable organizations and occasionally sent personal donations to individuals or more often attempted to direct them to other resources.
