SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

LexisNexis has filmed *The Papers of Eleanor Roosevelt, 1945–1952, Part 4: 1951–1952*, from the holdings at the Franklin D. Roosevelt Library in Hyde Park, New York. The vast amount of the collection comprises correspondence, but also includes newspaper and magazine clippings, brochures, poetry, music, photographs, drawings, and many miscellaneous items. The folder titles are organized in alphabetical order with a date or date span after each folder title. There are over nine hundred folders on twenty-one reels of film. Most of the correspondence came from the general public with the remaining coming from government officials, such as Harry S. Truman, Winston S. Churchill, Durward V. Sandifer, and Walter White; activists such as Henry Viscardi Jr.; representatives of organizations; members of royalty; and the Roosevelt family.

Eleanor Roosevelt's introduction as the "First Lady of the World" (Reel 5, Frame 0175) is a tribute to her extraordinary work as both delegate to the United Nations (UN) and head of the United Nations Human Rights Commission. In addition to her work at the UN, she was a spokesperson for human rights through her writing of magazine articles, her column "My Day," radio broadcasts, television appearances, and many speaking engagements throughout the world.

There were many requests from individuals, publications, and organizations for mention in Eleanor Roosevelt's column, "My Day," such as the twenty-fifth anniversary of *Parents' Magazine* (Reel 14, Frame 0444). She addressed current issues in the column and received much mail expressing praise as well as criticism from the press (Reel 15, Frames 0123 and 0136). In response to a letter, Eleanor Roosevelt wrote "I am sorry you feel that international cooperation is not worth trying. I am afraid you do not realize that the day has come when no nation can exist alone" (Reel 19, Frame 1044). In a column mentioning youth, she wrote about the twenty-fourth exchange of flags and friendship between students of the schools of Mexico and the United States—youth building a better world (Reel 18, Frame 0233).

Whether traveling for the UN or on personal visits, Eleanor Roosevelt was profoundly affected by what she saw and experienced. In a letter on behalf of the United Jewish Appeal (UJA), she wrote "The UJA needs great quantities of cash to speed the emigration of distressed Jews from danger areas like Iraq" (Reel 18, Frame 0757). Later she recounted, "I shall never forget the tragedy of some of the Jewish camps—tragedies of age and youth brought about by Hitler's barbaric racial and religious policies" (Reel 18, Frame 0811). There were numerous requests for donations, many to which she responded, including B'nai B'rith. Much of her interest in immigration, the aged, youth, and discrimination was fueled both by these experiences and by related correspondence from the public.

Some of the correspondence in the collection is of a very personal nature and gives a keyhole view of Eleanor Roosevelt's struggles. Referring to the affair of FDR, Ralph E. Cropley wrote: "By never acknowledging what I had done to keep such evidence of

Franklin's gay life from ever seeing the light of publicity, you hurt my feelings very much.... I wrote you I was destroying those pictures and films...in which you did not appear, but others who might be damaging to Franklin's memory, did" (Reel 5, Frame 0076). In a letter to a friend, Eleanor Roosevelt writes about her children and the 1952 presidential election: "We had fun during the Summer because John, who is a business man, quite naturally went all out for General Eisenhower. Elliott kept quiet but I think voted for him in the end. Jimmy, Franklin Junior, my daughter Anna and I, on the other hand, went as far as we could for Governor Stevenson and still managed though we argued violently when we met, to speak to each other at the end of the campaign" (Reel 15, Frame 0166).

Eleanor Roosevelt actively participated in charities and causes that helped those less fortunate. The public felt close to her and would often request money and favors of acquiring passports, among other things. At times she felt overwhelmed by the requests and always replied that she could not possibly help everyone, but occasionally she would receive a song or a poem like the following: "Hear the prayer of the little sick child, the paralytic child of Warm Springs...for his is the voice of an angel with clipped wings" (Reel 6, Frame 0087).

The Roosevelt family dog, Fala, died in April 1952 and was buried in Hyde Park at the foot of FDR's grave. In life, Fala sat at the feet of FDR and therefore it seemed appropriate that he be buried at FDR's feet (Reel 4, Frame 0627 and Reel 6, Frame 0732). The public recognized the importance of Fala in Eleanor Roosevelt's life, and numerous notes of sympathy arrived at her Hyde Park residence.

Eleanor Roosevelt resigned from the Human Rights Commission (Reel 6, Frame 0446 and Reel 8, Frame 0728) and retired from the United Nations (Reel 10, Frame 0101) in 1952.

EDITORIAL NOTE

This microform collection comprises a wide variety of correspondence received by Eleanor Roosevelt during the post–White House years. The General Correspondence File consists primarily of incoming correspondence except for a small quantity of carbon copies of outgoing correspondence. In general, carbon copies were not kept for every typed outgoing letter nor were copies made of outgoing handwritten material. The General Correspondence File is subdivided into three chronological series: 1945–1952, 1953–1956, and 1957–1962. The file folders of correspondence in each series are arranged in alphabetical order, with the individual documents in chronological order within each folder.

LexisNexis has microfilmed all of the documents dated 1948 through 1949 within each alphabetically arranged folder in the 1945–1952 series as *The Eleanor Roosevelt Papers from the FDR Library, General Correspondence, Part 4: 1951–1952*. A small number of documents outside the 1948–1949 time frame have been microfilmed. These are primarily responses or follow-up letters to earlier correspondence and have been included in an effort to provide the researcher with a complete record on a specific topic or action.

Recognized by many as the “First Lady of the World,” Eleanor Roosevelt worked as both delegate to the United Nations (UN) and head of the United Nations Human Rights Commission. Her interests were broad—forging trails leading the fight against discrimination for the aged, the immigrant, and minorities.

In addition to her work at the UN, Eleanor Roosevelt was a spokesperson for human rights through her writings of magazine articles, her column “My Day,” radio broadcasts, television appearances, and many speaking engagements throughout the world. She addressed current issues in her column and received much mail expressing praise as well as criticism, including hate mail (Reel 15, Frames 0123 and 0136). In response to a letter Eleanor Roosevelt wrote “I am sorry you feel that international cooperation is not worth trying. I am afraid you do not realize that the day has come when no nation can exist alone” (Reel 19, Frame 1044). She received much mail responding to her column and tried to answer every letter no matter how trivial or whether it was a negative or positive response.

Whether traveling for the UN or on personal visits, Eleanor Roosevelt was profoundly affected by what she saw and experienced. In a letter on behalf of the United Jewish Appeal (UJA) she wrote “The UJA needs great quantities of cash to speed the emigration of distressed Jews from danger areas like Iraq (Reel 18, Frame 0757) and later recounting, “I shall never forget the tragedy of some of the Jewish camps—tragedies of age and youth brought about by Hitler’s barbaric racial and religious policies” (Reel 18, Frame 0811).

Some of the correspondence in the collection is of a very personal nature and gives a keyhole view of Eleanor Roosevelt’s struggles. Referring to Franklin D. Roosevelt’s affair, Ralph E. Cropley wrote “By never acknowledging what I had done to keep such evidence of Franklin’s gay life from ever seeing the light of publicity, you hurt my feelings very much.... I wrote you I was destroying those pictures and films...in which you did not appear, but others who might be damaging to Franklin’s memory, did” (Reel 5, Frame 0076). Eleanor Roosevelt actively participated in charities and causes that helped those less fortunate. The public felt close to her and would often request money and favors of acquiring passports among other things. At times she felt overwhelmed by the requests and always replied that she could not possibly help everyone, but occasionally she would receive a song or a poem like the following: “Hear the prayer of the little sick child, the paralytic child of Warm Springs...for his is the voice of an angel with clipped wings” (Reel 6, Frame 0087).

Eleanor Roosevelt resigned from the Human Rights Commission and retired from the United Nations in 1952. The culmination of her life’s work in these documents is a rare gift to researchers.
