Introduction This microfiche collection consists of three distinct sub-collections. The first draws upon the Columbia University Oral History Collection, Part IV. It contains seven oral histories on Theodore Roosevelt and his family, including one from his oldest daughter, Alice Roosevelt Longworth. The second sub-collection contains five microfiches regarding Theodore Roosevelt's brief visit to the Netherlands in late April and early May, 1910, during a European tour. These contain articles from the Dutch newspaper Algemeen Handelsblad. The third sub-collection contains forty-five fiches of the Theodore Roosevelt Association Journal, which is published quarterly by the Theodore Roosevelt Association and combines scholarly articles, book reviews and human interest pieces with news about the Association. The fiches run from 1974 until 1987.
