In commemoration of Black Achievement Month in October, the Roosevelt Institute for American Studies will organize a film screening of the documentary *Three Women* and panel discussion with director Ida Does and winti priestess Marian Markelo.

In the documentary *Three Women*, award winning film director and producer Ida Does follows three women's involvement in the heritage of slavery: Valika Smeulders (heritage expert), Marian Markelo (winti priestess), and Ellen-Rose Kambel (researcher). All three women advocate for a considered recognition of the role of slavery in Dutch history. The documentary is an expression of a worldwide movement in which black people and people of color take pride and strength in their history.

After the film screening there will be a panel discussion with director Ida Does and winti priestess Marian Markelo. The event will be moderated by RIAS PhD candidates Manar Ellethy, Christine Mertens, and Marcella Schute.
