

## **RESEARCH GRANT APPLICATION**

The Roosevelt Institute for American Studies holds a unique collection of primary materials in the field of American twentieth century history, including:

- Papers of Presidential Administrations from Theodore Roosevelt to Richard Nixon;
- The personal papers of several leading figures in American politics and foreign relations, including Cordell Hull and Henry Stimson.
- JFK, LBJ, Columbia University, and ADST Oral History Collections;
- Specialized archive collections on the New Deal, Civil Rights, and the Vietnam War;

These holdings make it possible for European scholars and students to research various topics related to U.S. history at the RIAS without crossing the Atlantic or to do preliminary work at the RIAS that will prepare them for a more extensive research trip to the United States. European scholars at all stages in their careers (advanced students preparing for a master's or doctoral degree, and scholars preparing a publication) are invited to apply for a research grant. The grant consists of a per diem of € 50 (covering bed and breakfast in a low-budget hotel), payment for a rail ticket/ferry ticket. The research period at the Roosevelt Institute of American Studies must be one (minimum) to four (maximum) weeks. The maximum of the grant is € 600.

All applications for a grant involving research work leading to a master's or doctoral degree must be endorsed by the professor supervising the work. The Roosevelt Institute of American Studies can only offer a limited number of grants and will divide them between applicants from different European countries.

**Applications for a Roosevelt Institute for American Studies Research Grant should be submitted at least two months before the desired period of research.**
