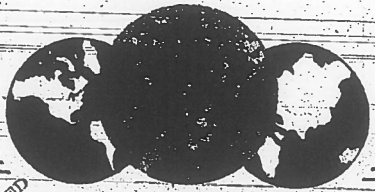

My dear Mr. President:

Enclosed you will please find three mimeographed letters, dated April 26th, May 5th and June 18th, 1936, addressed to ALL MEMBERS of Congress, and copy of letter of June 18th, 1936, addressed to Honorable Elmer Thomas, Chairman, Senate Committee on Indian Affairs. These letters contain the substance of the objections which The American Indian Federation has consistently made to the present regime of the Indian Bureau and the program emanating therefrom. These objections have heretofore been called to your attention by formal memorials and resolutions, under date of December 21st, 1934, and January 9, 1936. The enclosures, the Printed Hearings on H. R. 7781, February 11th, 1935; the suppressed brief filed by this organization in opposition to S. 2047, with the House Committee on Indian Affairs, and the suppressed briefs filed with the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs in regard to the Cherokee case in North Carolina, are all respectfully called to your attention.

The objections of The American Indian Federation are based upon the fact that the Christ-mocking, Communist-aiding, subversive and seditious American Civil Liberties Union, as outlined in the documents mentioned, now dominates and controls the Indian Bureau and its entire program - - administrative, legislative and educational. And, that this group is establishing communism and destroying Christianity among the Indians of the United States in accordance with the aim of the A. C. L. U., whose Executive Director, Roger N. Baldwin, says: "Communism is the Goal".

The Congress of the United States has just passed a bill, S. 2047, entitled, "To promote the general welfare of the Indians of the State of Oklahoma, and for other purposes". This bill, like its predecessor, public 383 of the 73rd Congress, from which Oklahoma Indians were exempted, legalizes the establishment of Communism in the State of Oklahoma - - Osage County excepted.
