MEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

with reference to the attached press release in which Chairman Dies of the House Committee on Un-American Activities states that Justice Department Agents had been investigating him as well as witnesses who have appeared before his Committee you are advised that the Bureau has not investigated either Dies or the litnesses. The Bureau has, of course, interviewed a number of witnesses who appeared before the Dies Committee as a result of the request of the Criminal Division that we investigate the testimony of Edwin P. Banta and the related testimony in which it is alleged that persons employed on the rederal Writers Project in New Jersey and New York were actually engaged in the preparation and dissemination of Communist literature and propaganda. I have checked with Mr. Starr and he has stated definitely and positively that we have never said or done anything which would even infer that we were investigating Congressman Dies and as a matter of fact his name has never come up in connection with any of the interviews conducted. Mr. Starr advises that he has been most careful to explain to each person interviewed the procedure followed in investigations predicated upon Congressional or cenatorial inquiries, pointing out that the results of the Congressional inquiry which is to determine the facts in a particular situation, are referred to the Department of Justice which, after a study of the major aspects involved, refers them to the FBI for an investigation. Mr. Starr followed this procedure because questions were asked by various witnesses interviewed as to why-the-Bureau-did-not-investigate frregularities thefts and grafts which were alleged to be taken in the administration of various projects of the PAPA.

The cureau has absolutely no information concerning Dies on the sureau has continues or concerning land involved in a title dispute. The Bureau has confined itself solely to the investigation of the aspects of the case in which the Criminal Division has requested investigation.

It appears probable that this outburst of Dies emanates originally from Steve Birmingham since it follows generally the theme of the attached letter dated January 21, 1939, sourcessed to you by Edwin P. Banta. Banta is a paid informant of Steve Birmingham's, who was in turn employed by the Dies Committee as an investigator. It appears that Birmingham is trying to attr up something in order to make his job last as long as possible.
