

MUORTEVA'S ACTIVITY IN THE UNITED STATES,
PREVIOUS TO APRIL, 1919.

(A) Prior to 1914.

Radical; Finnish I.W.W.
Editor of extreme Left Paper,
Head of Finnish Revolutionists.

(B) 1914 to 1917:

War breaks out in Europe—
his activity contre-Russia.

(C) To March, 1919:

Finnish and Russian Revolutions.

(a) Finns of Fitchburg; Raivaaja; opposes registration
for draft (June, 1918.); directs radicals to enlist in
U.S. Army and Navy and prepare for Revolution in the
U. S.; I. W. W. also encouraging enlistments of foreigners.

(b) Muorteva as "Ambassador"; People's Republic of Fin-
land (1917-18)

(c) Fitchburg center for radical activity—liaison with
Muorteva in New York.

(d) I. W. W. delegates at meeting of New England State
Finns, in Fitchburg (Apr. 20, 1918); autos used to spread
literature; racial groups used by the I.W.W.

(e) Bohman, at Fitchburg, outlined revolution; Muorteva
urges buying a machine gun; Red Guards vs. White Guards;
Usenius Muorteva's agent for carrying funds to Finland,
visited by high-powered auto at night; Muorteva solicits
funds for Red Guards, money to have been carried by Usenius
apparently base for propaganda across Finnish-Swedish Border.

(f) Astolfi's article (11-2-18) on collections to "help
Finland"; radical press, Tyomes, Toveri, Industrialisti;
Finnish radical press controlled by Muorteva and Bohman.

(g) Muorteva, frequent speaker at Socialist and radical
gatherings, receives funds from Bolsheviks in Christiania,
thru CARL SANDBURG, apparently part of 2,000,000 roubles
appropriated for Bolshevik internationalist movement.

(h) U. S. Military Intelligence decides Muorteva Dangerous
(August, 1918); documents taken by Task Committee under file
of "Finnish Information Bureau" tie up subject with Spartacists
of Germany and Moscow.

(i) I. W. W., John Ranta connecting link; meetings at
German residence, also Peter Tyom's, Fitchburg; revolution
discussed; entertainment for young people, as means of
increasing membership; secret meetings of Finnish radicals;
Muorteva in New York, "Finnish ambassador"; revolutionary news
by personal contact.
