

Harry Stecopoulos, Professor of English at the University of Iowa, teaches courses on modern US literature, African American literature, transnational American Studies, the energy humanities, and creative writing.

In addition to *Telling America's Story to the World* (Oxford, 2022) his publications include *Reconstructing the World: Southern Fictions and US Imperialisms*, 1898-1976 (Cornell, 2008), and the edited collection *A History of the Literature of the U.S. South* (Cambridge, 2021). He is currently working on two book projects: "A Keen Sense of Power: Richard Wright, Energy, and the Violence of Extraction" and "Entangled Words: Diplomacy and the Making of American Literature."
