Roosevelt Lecture
by Valika Smeulders
on Thursday 9 November 2023



Valika Smeulders, born on Curaçao, is head of the Department of History at the Rijksmuseum in Amsterdam. From 2017 till 2020 she was conservator at the Rijksmuseum and at the same time did postdoctoral research at KITLV/Royal Netherlands Institute of Southeast Asian and Caribbean Studies in Leiden on the research project "Traveling Caribbean Heritage."

Valika Smeulders studied Languages and Cultures of Latin America at Leiden University and got a PhD from the Erasmus University Rotterdam on *Slavernij in perspectief*. Her latest publications include *Slavernij* (co-author, 2021), *Het koloniale en slavernijverleden van Hofstad Den Haag* (editor and co-author, 2022), a chapter in *Staat en slavernij* (2023) and *Ons koloniale verleden in 50 voorwerpen* (editor, 2023).

In 2019 Valika Smeulders received the Black Achievement Award in the category Education and Research.
