She is the author of *Planning for the Planet* (2019), Benelux representative to the European Society for Environmental History, and co-editor-in-chief of the *Journal for the History of Knowledge*.

Where does global environmental governance happen?

We might think of the negotiation spaces of intergovernmental conferences, such as Stockholm 1972, Rio 1992, or Paris 2015. Often, these formal settings have dominated the historiography on international environmentalism.

In this talk, Dr. Schleper would like to open up a different history of global environmental governance, showing that some consequential forces shaping it have operated from elsewhere: from private homes, from field stations, through correspondence, and behind-the-scenes negotiations by actors who appear less prominently in the official records.

Dr. Schleper will attend to these 'elsewheres' by revisiting some of her recent research on informal elites and the gatekeeping roles of geographically peripheral members of international organizations.
